History/Fun Facts:

- In 1966, President Johnson fixed Father's Day on the third Sunday in June.
- In 1972 Father's Day became a national observance.
- There are more collect calls on Father's Day than any other day of the year.
- The earliest known version of the necktie was found in the massive mausoleum of China's first emperor, Shih Huang Ti, dating from around 210 B.C.
