HAWAIIAN LUAU

Aloha, a 'olu'olu luana ka luau! In other words, hello, and please enjoy the luau!

History/Fun Facts:

- Sometimes spelled “lu’au”, it is a traditional Hawaiian feast that includes music, hula dancing, and fire dancing.
- Originally luaus were called ‘aha ‘aina and held for community ceremonies and major events.
- Captain James Cook was the first European to set foot in Hawaii in 1778.
- The Hawaiian language has only 12 letters: A E I O U and H K L M N P W. The language also makes use of a “glottal stop”, signified by this symbol: ‘
- Hawaii is the most isolated population center on Earth. It is 2,390 miles from California and 4,900 miles from China.
- Hawaii is the only US state that grows coffee.
- Hawaii has its own time zone (Hawaiian Standard Time), and does not observe Daylight Savings Time.
- The island of Kauai is home to the wettest spot on Earth, Mt. Waialeale. The average yearly rainfall is about 397 inches.
