History/Fun Facts:

- St. Patrick became a Christian missionary to Ireland after being held captive there in his youth and dreaming of converting all the Irish people to Christianity.
- Legend has it that St. Patrick drove all the snakes out of Ireland. However, there never were any snakes in Ireland, and the story symbolizes Christianity driving out the pagan religions.
- The holiday is celebrated on March 17th because that is the date that St. Patrick is believed to have died.
- The Irish Potato Famine (also known as the Great Hunger, or An Gorta Mor in Gaelic), began in 1845 due to a blight on the country's potato crops.
- The Claddagh symbolizes friendship (hands), loyalty (crown), and love (heart). Wearing the ring with the heart turned inward traditionally means the person is spoken for; turned outward means they are not.
- The shamrock was sacred to the ancient Druids, because its 3 leaves formed a triad.
- The Irish Free State, comprising four-fifths of Ireland, was declared on December 6, 1921.
- People born on March 17: Mia Hamm, Rob Lowe, Gary Sinise, Kurt Russell, Nat "King" Cole
